Road Safety : Most people are taking heed of the advice regarding safe parking and drop offs. Please remember the previous message—**Don't take the risk**. Being late or "It was only a quick drop off," are no excuse. Ultimately, it will result in a fine for you, but more importantly could end in tears for a child.



Parents' Night : Many thanks to everyone who managed to attend our recent parents' night. Our attendance figures show that 90% of parents/carers attended. The children always value the conversations that take place and the support given. I have now collated the parents' night questionnaires and share the top responses from each question.

Q1– How can we develop outdoor learning?

A—32% of respondents would like more outdoor equipment, 25% would like the garden area developed and 15 % would like more sports areas, particularly football.

Q2—Have you heard of GIRFEC before?

A– 68% said no , 32 replied yes.

Q3—Can you please give any general/specific feedback?

A– 78% positive comments, 9% raised issues and 13% gave a variety of suggestions.
